PRESIDENTS IN

The railroad affected Logan County in many ways, including bringing many famous people to the area, especially politicians.

The late 19th century/first half of the 20th century saw several presidents or presidential candidates give "whistle stop" speeches in Bellefontaine and the county. You have to remember that back then television was not yet invented and radio was just becoming popular so people did not "see" or "hear" the president as often as we do today on television. Thus, presidential hopefuls had to go out among the people more to help get their political ideas and plans to the voters.

On October 13, 1890 President Benjamin Harrison spoke briefly in DeGraff, where a group of students welcomed him to the village. Harrison then made another brief stop and speech in Bellefontaine. Bellefontaine schools were released early that day so students could see the president.

William McKinley came to Bellefontaine on several occasions first as Governor of Ohio in 1891, again in 1894 for the dedication of Memorial Hall and then as President of the U.S. in 1897. McKinley's Democratic opponent William Jennings Bryan also came to Logan County.

The first half of the 20th century saw several presidents or presidential hopefuls in Logan County. President Theodore Roosevelt spoke in Bellefontaine in 1907. He came back in 1912 when he ran for President on the Progressive Party ticket. William Howard Taft stopped and spoke in both Bellefontaine and West Liberty. Woodrow Wilson also campaigned in Logan County. In the 1920s Warren G. Harding came to Bellefontaine as did Herbert Hoover.

The 1930s and 40s brought Franklin Delano Roosevelt and two of his opponents, Wendell Wilke and Thomas Dewey. President Harry Truman also stopped and spoke in Bellefontaine in 1952 campaigning for Adlai Stevenson. The same year saw half of the Republican ticket come to Bellefontaine with Vice-Presidential candidate Richard Nixon speaking to a large crowd in hopes of having them vote for the Eisenhower-Nixon ticket.

During the 1992 election President George Bush passed through West Mansfield and then on through Ridgeway, where the train slowed but did not stop. Bill Clinton also came through the county but did not stop.

This list may not include all of the presidents and candidates that came to Bellefontaine on the railroad. However, this impressive list does show yet another reason why the railroad was so important to the area's history.
