





2016 marks the 125th anniversary of George Bartholomew's innovative contribution to the world of transportation – concrete pavement. In 1891 Bartholomew made a deal with the Bellefontaine City Council to pave a test section on Main Street with his formula of concrete, made in Logan County at the Buckeye Portland Cement Company in Marl City near Rushsylvania, which he guaranteed would hold up to the horse & wagon traffic of downtown Bellefontaine. By 1893 council members were convinced, and along with the business owners and the county commissioners, contracted to have the streets around the Courthouse paved with Bartholomew's concrete. Court Avenue remains the oldest concrete street in America, with around 60% of the street still paved in Bartholomew's original concrete.

On April 25th the Logan County History Center was honored to be one of the stops for a consortium of representatives in the concrete industry during the group's visit to Bellefontaine to see Court Avenue and tour the LCHC Transportation Museum. More than fifty members traveled on bus and by car from a national concrete convention in Columbus to Bellefontaine to see first-hand Logan County's vital role in transportation history and the history of concrete.

Several members came to LCHC Archives prior to the celebration to research Mr. Bartholomew, the Buckeye Portland Cement Co. and Court Avenue. The archives proved to be a wealth of resources for them. The staff and volunteers in archives were a great help to the researchers. Don Corwin, who volunteers in the archives and is the pre-eminent local historian on Marl City, was an especially important resource to the researchers. In addition to helping with their research Don also started to reorganize all of our "Oldest Concrete Street" and Marl City information in the archives to make it easier for future researchers.
