"The Dependence on European Trade Goods by 18th Century Native Americans in the Ohio Country"

A visual study of recovered materials from 1760s~1790s era Historic Indian sites in Ohio

Presented by Wm Gregory Shipley

Mr Shipley's program will discuss the obvious changes to the material culture of Ohio's Historic Indian tribes which had occurred by the second half of the 18th century. These changes resulted from the increased availability of European trade goods. After a century of having access to the numerous varieties of durable trade items, which



were being obtained with increasing ease and in larger quantities, the majority of discarded, lost, and/or abandoned materials on Native American sites had become "Euro", in flavor. Through his PowerPoint presentation, Mr Shipley will share images and data summaries on the various categories of Indian trade (and raid) related weapons, tools, storage vessels, ornamental items, etc, which have been recovered from a dozen private-property village sites, in central and western Ohio, during the past 26 years of avocational archaeological investigations.

The meeting will be held on Wednesday, October 16th at 7:00 p.m. in the AcuSport Meeting Room and is free and open to the public.

Hello everyone. It has been another busy year for our History Center! I want to reflect on some of the activities of this year but since this will be my last article as your president (term limits you know!), I wanted to mention other significant accomplishments we have achieved during that time.

One of the large projects that was completed was the restoration (and a lot of re-creation since much of it was missing) of the Wissler Bi-plane that is now hanging in the atrium. This was included in the vision for the Transportation Museum but also prior to that by those that went out on a limb to save it, acquire it, store it, hoping it would someday be able to be displayed so everyone could see & understand this part of our history.

Another large project was the Mansion Roof replacement, this was a huge project! Not only from the perspective of the work that was completed, but the research of the original manufacturer of the tile, determining they were still in business & made the same product that we were able to use to preserve the appearance of this cornerstone of our complex! But also the fundraising for this project... this was all made possible by generous members of our History Center, local corporations, and countless other donations! A huge "Thank You" to everyone, as this is a project that needed to be done to preserve the Mansion & will not need to be re-visited for hopefully another 100 years!

We also have continued with maintenance/up-keep projects like tuck pointing the mortar in the brick, damage control with installation of covers over the HVAC units out back after ice damaged the units last winter, constant painting & repair of all of the facility...thanks to John and all the volunteers for this!

We have been able to continue our partnership with all the schools in the county to bring the students into the History Center on field trips to see firsthand & learn the history of the county they live in but also give them a look back in time to help understand life before the "Smartphone!" Hopefully this has helped spur their interest in history & other hobbies, etc. Huge thanks to Todd & all the Docents that keep this running smoothly!

We also started a project last year with Ohio Highpoint to have a student work with us on our social media (Facebook). We got started late in the year but came up with some good ideas and good data & are going to continue this year. Our goal is to get our information out to more people of all age groups and this seems to be a very effective method and where most people are receiving their info these days. We will expand to Instagram this year, more pics of our facility & activities to draw visitors in! Thanks to Mr. Lascher OHP Program Director & Gavin (last year's student) and John McPherson who heads up our Facebook activities.

The word has continued to spread of what a great facility we have to host events. The Atrium for large events, AcuSport & Presidents' meeting rooms for meetings/etc., and the Mansion for special events... keep spreading the word! We have rented out space to Honda, ISS America, McDonalds, Republican & Democratic parties, Logan County Chamber, Athenians, DAR, Mary Rutan, Edward Jones, and numerous Class Reunions, to mention just a few! These events help introduce our facility to more people & also help offset our operating costs...Thanks to everyone!

Rental of our facility also helps us get introduced to many from outside our area. The Piecemakers Quilt Show has brought in many from outside our area and this year we hosted the 1st Bellefontaine Hill Climb Revival, which is going to return on a yearly basis & surely grow and bring in more new visitors.

We can't talk about facility usage and not mention the other events that bring in so many local families... KidFest Halloween festivities, this is such a great time for the kids and their families!

Christmas Open House... what a great time to get together with families, check out the great decorations throughout the Mansion & Museums (all the staff and volunteers that work so hard on the preparation & decoration deserve a huge thank you!), and listen to the student musicians' performances. Also we have other wonderful groups that perform in the Atrium, I think this is an undiscovered gem during this Open House...there are great performances by many groups! Please take time to invite other family & friends to these performances... wonderful people & performances!

Our most recent large exhibit "Automotive Manufacturing in Logan County" has been a big hit and we want to thank the manufacturers for working with us. They gave their time, examples of their products, company information, etc.

A huge part of this exhibit is the 40 years of Honda in Ohio which chronicles Hondas growth in Ohio from the original Motorcycle Plant to the current day. This portion of the exhibit is in the connector and we would like to thank Honda and especially Stacey Kuhns, the Service Center staff, & Pat Culp (Vital Signs) for all their help with this exhibit!

We have also been fortunate to receive some press coverage thru the "Out & About Columbus", recent " Columbus Dispatch" article, which we have seen a surge of visitors from the Columbus, Delaware, Marysville areas. So getting the word out does work. So please continue to share information to your friends, families, clubs, church groups, organizations! We just need to get people in the doors to fully utilize our facilities & build support in the community.

I also cannot emphasize enough the importance of the Tax Levy that we have to renew on a regular basis. Without this levy we cannot continue to operate, it's that simple! The cost of this is approximately \$8.00/100k of home value per year... so little to support so much! The Logan County Historical Society and History Center will have a 0.25 mill replacement operating levy on the November 5th, 2019 ballot. The 5-year levy would allow the Society and History Center to continue to better serve and educate the people of Logan County through exhibits, school tours, special events, publications, historic presentations and much more.

The 0.25 mill replacement levy will cost the home owners very little money. A resident whose home is valued at \$100,000 will pay around \$8.10 per year. As our levy slogan goes *It Costs So Little To Save So Much!*

The passing of the levy is also necessary for the History Center to continue to be open year-round (seven days a week between office & museum hours), employ the upkeep and improvement of the History Center's 1906 Orr Mansion, the Logan

a professional staff and continue the upkeep and improvement of the History Center's 1906 Orr Mansion, the Logan County Museum, the Logan County Transportation Museum, and the Flatwoods School.

The levy would also make it possible for the Society to continue its many programs and projects and develop new ones. The Society offers a variety of programs including bimonthly meetings, speeches to groups, school tours and programs (nearly 1,000 students in the 2018-2019 and over 150 hours of local history instruction) and much more. The Historical Society is very proud of its relationship with area schools and the role it plays in the students' education. The Historical Society's Young Historians club has also been a great success over the years with its members learning about the county's rich history through a variety of fun and interactive activities.

It would be impossible for us to include all that the Logan County Historical Society and Museum provides to the people of Logan County. The support from the citizens of Logan County in the past has made it possible for the Logan County History Center to become one of the most respected county historical society museums in the state. The county's support through the operating levy is truly exceptional and greatly appreciated. We hope you will once again support us on November 5th.


