ORNER Greetings to our Friends and Neighbors:

To say 2020 was an unusual and difficult year would be a vast understatement. The pandemic and subsequent mandates affected the Logan County History Center in many ways from having to shut our doors for several months and missing out on our school field trips to canceling in-person programs and not being able to have local businesses and organizations use our meeting rooms and facilities. Yet, we hope the lessons we learned from the difficulties of this past year will make us a better museum and organization in the future.

We truly missed our work with the hundreds of students who usually tour the History Center, go on our Logan County Landmark field trip and take part in our traveling programs in their classrooms. However, we still wanted to contribute to the students' curriculum so with the help of Brian Jones Media we made virtual tours of the History Center that we put on our website (www.loganhistory.org) for the teachers and students to view as part of their lessons on local history. While we can't wait until we are able to once again have school field trips (and adult group tours and programming) we are working on having more virtual programming to better serve our student (and adult patrons) in the future. This includes having a virtual tour of the Orr Mansion and Logan County Museum decorated for the 2020 Christmas holidays.

The History Center did debut several new exhibits in 2020. In honor of Bellefontaine's bicentennial, we have an exhibit stretching throughout much of the Museum. Since we had to postpone our spring open house celebrating Bellefontaine's bicentennial, the exhibit will remain up throughout 2021. We also debuted an exhibit on the history of fraternal orders in Logan County. This was a collaborative effort with several different organizations that are still active in the area who provided information, photographs and artifacts for the exhibit. Another new exhibit was Never Be Bored with Board Games in the Museum's Toy Room. These latter two exhibits will remain up for the next couple of years.

We also started a major restoration project on the Orr Mansion's exterior with the replacement of the front porch columns and capitals and repairs to the 3rd floor ballroom dormers. More work on the mansion will continue in 2021. Unfortunately, this type of restoration work is specialized and beyond the regular maintenance of the historic home.

We are asking you for your help. Included with this letter is a membership and donor card; we hope you will consider one or more of the options available. 
