

By 1874, ads for Holiday presents were plentiful, including this one from Case's.







By January, Christmas letters from the soldiers were showing up. This is part of one from Dr. A.J. McCracken who was stationed in Coblentz, Germany describing Christmas day in the hospital where he worked.



Logan County's 75th year, the ads were large and plentiful, such as this one form Dec. 12, 1893. But during Logan County's Centennial in 1918, there were so many deaths from the Spanish Flu Epidemic, and so many soldiers away from home in the Great War, that Christmas took a back seat in the newspapers.



By 1943, ads were starting by Thanksgiving. While store ads such as Montgomery Wards suggested a "Practical Christmas", competing ads said not to spend money, but use it to buy War Bonds.


